

Merger Timeline

- Summer 2019: Tabor and LHOP pursue strategic planning
- Fall 2019: Explore partnership possibilities with Executive Teams
- November 2019: Working group explores big questions and deal breakers
- <u>January 2020</u>: Both boards attend meeting facilitated by a consultant to present findings of initial meeting of Working Group
- <u>February 28, 2020</u>: Both Boards voted unanimously to pursue legal process to re-organize
- March October 2020: LHOP main office moves to Tabor and teams work together to optimize client service during pandemic
- November 2020: Legal approval finalized and both 501c3 orgs continue
- January 2021: All staff brought under Tabor umbrella for pay and benefits / Internal communications strategy launched




