Our Impact

Hourglass brings the community together across sectors to spark dialogue and provide solutions for Lancaster County issues. Some of our recent programming includes:

Housing Deliberative Forum (August 2023)

In collaboration with Franklin & Marshall College, Hourglass convened 48 randomly selected residents representative of Lancaster County to gather informed public input on our community's housing challenges. The group, briefed in advance on local housing issues and given access to experts, deliberated solutions to topics such as increasing housing supply, affordable housing, and the impacts of growth and development. This work was generously

funded by the Lancaster County Community Foundation, High Foundation, and Steinman Foundation. Results can be found at: HourglassLancaster.org/Housing.

Community Forums:

Hourglass hosted a number of forums for the entire community including:

- Strong Towns (April 12 & 13, 2023)

 Chuck Marohn, president and founder of Strong Towns, gave two days of talks on growth and development—touching on issues such as infrastructure, housing, local government, entrepreneurship, and transportation. These discussions centered on enhancing community resilience.
- Community Engagement for Local Democracy (June 6, 2023)
 In collaboration with the City of Lancaster and the Bloomberg
 Center for Public Innovation, this forum showcased innovative
 strategies for increasing civic participation. The forum included
 a keynote from Terrance Smith, innovation fellow at Johns
 Hopkins University, and a presentation on the city's Department
 of Neighborhood Engagement.







• Trust in Our Elections: A Community Conversation (February 8, 2024)

This informative, nonpartisan event provided our community a deeper understanding of the 2024 election process to combat misinformation surrounding election integrity. Panelists included former Pennsylvania Governor Tom Corbett, former federal judge John Jones, Lancaster County Commissioner Ray D'Agostino, and more. This event was held in partnership with Keep Our Republic and the Steinman Institute for Civic Engagement with support from the Lancaster County Community Foundation.





Fiscal Year 2023 Revenues


