Background on CWS Lancaster

- "Refugee Capital" of the US
- Welcomed over 1,100 refugees in South Central PA just in FY24
- Worked with other populations:
 Ukrainians, Afghans, Cubans, Haitians
- Variety of services:
 - **Welcome:** (housing, cultural orientation...)
 - Integration (economic empowerment; health and family wellness)
 - Legal (Green Cards, naturalization, etc.)
- Employment placed over 800 people in jobs in the last 5 years in Lancaster



Current Threats to Work

- Refugee/travel ban
- Missed Presidential Determination
- Loss of legal status for millions (TPS, Parole)
- Change in asylum eligibility requirements



Other hurdles and CWS response

- Due process concerns for immigration enforcement
- Defense services/PIAC Clinic
- HR 1: OBBBA elimination of SNAP and Medicaid for refugee
- CWS Food Pantry




Stagnant Population Change in Pennsylvania, 1920 to 2050 (Projected)

Net Domestic Migration, 2020 to 2024




Pennsylvania Net International and Domestic Migration, 2020 to 2024

Note: Pennsylvania had 551,644 births compared to 629,193 deaths from 2020 to 2024.



Statewide Total Net Domestic Migration, 2020 to 2024




Statewide Total Net Domestic Migration, 2020 to 2024 = -49,031
